D. J. Sawyer, a Wealthy Resident of Jonesport, Maine, Died

Forest Fire Driven by High
Winds, Reported to be Advancing on Village.

A gentleman who arrived in town this afternoon from Westfield, said the forest fire, which had been raging around the Inglewood property was rapidly approaching Westfield, and at the time he left there, was only eight miles from the village, near Bellwedere Lake, on the north. The wind is favorable to the fire's aproach on Westfield, and if it does not die before night it is expected to reach the village. The people are making determined efforts to check the blaze.

Calais, Me., June 10—(Special)—D. J. Sawyer, known as the wealthiest resident of Jonesport, Maine, and a prominent ship-owner, was found dead in bed this morning at the residence of Henry B. Ross, whose guest he was. Mr. Sawyer was a deacon of the Congregational church, and was attending the conference which closed on Wednesday evening. He was to return home today, and the discovery of his death was made when the host went to call him. He was eighty-five years old. Heart trouble was given as the cause of death.
