After the great reformation effected by Hezekiah, the Passover for that year was observed on the 14th, with great demonstrations of joy, and being supplied by the liberality of Hezekiah and the princes, the congregation continued to keep the feast an additional seven days with great rejoicing. In this month, in the 4th year of his reign, Solomon commenced the building of the Temple, which he had been divinely appointed to erect, and for which his father King David had previously made great preparations the work was completed in about seven years.—1 Kings vi. 37-38, 1 Chron. xxix.
