

Italian Situation Reviewed By Sidney Low

ALLIED HELP GREATLY NEEDED

Writer Thinks Italy May be Forced to Peace if Drive Goes Far Enough - On Other Hand Allies May Turn Situation Into Great

London, Oct. 80-(Montreal Gazette cable)—Under the heading "Save Italy; Urgent Need of Franco-British Help," Sidney Low writes as follows in the Daily Chronicle.

"Another sudden terrible crisis of the war has arisen. It may prove the beginning of the end for good or ill. The Italian armies of the Isonzo have been disastrously defeated for the moment—we hope only for the moment. It is almost a debacle. The Italian line is falling back before the Austro-German host with its concentrated and overhost, with its concentrated and over-powering artillery.

"Cadorna may have to retire behind Tagliamento or even farther. We seem

to be witnessing the beginning of one of those great drives which massed infantry and the march of heavy guns like those which carried the Austro-Germans over Poland, Serbia, and Roumania Another large tract of allied territory— Fruli and Veneto, with their rich and noble cities and fertile fields—may fall

into the destroying hands which have ravaged Belgium and northern France. "If Cadorna cannot stay the rush, he might even be compelled to withdraw across the river Po and leave all Lom bardy and Piedmont to the mercy o the invader. That, however, will not happen for the reason that before this stage is reached Italy will have made
