### THE SHIRKERS

A Round-up By Police in England

(Weekly Scotsman).  
Raid by the police in search of eligible men for the army were made on Saturday at picture houses, theatres, a football ground, and at the seaside in England, with varying degrees of success.

At Ormskirk the raid was conducted at picture palaces in a novel way. On the screen appeared the words, "All men of military age please step up." Then the lights were turned on, and all who stood were asked for exemption certificates. Many were without, and they were taken to the recruiting office, and had to report themselves this morning.

A force of police and special constables at Colwyn Bay accosted men in the front and in the queues outside the places of amusement, and about 100 were unable to respond to the queries of the police in a satisfactory manner, and were escorted to the police station, where they were interrogated by military officers. Among the number were three English sergeants who had doffed their uniforms and were wearing flannels. The net result of the raid was that six men were found unable to account for their absence from the forces. They were informed that they would be called up within fourteen days.

The Carlisle city police, in conjunction

with the military authorities, carried out a systematic raid on men of military age on Saturday. Several hundred who had no documentary evidence of exemption or medical rejection were conveyed to Carlisle Castle.

At Leeds on Saturday night the military and the police descended upon crowds waiting outside the theatres and other places of amusement and interrogated men of apparently military age. Most of the men were able to show bona-fides, but a few names and addresses were taken.

Similar action was taken at the grounds of the Birmingham Football Club, where police and military were posted at all the entrances.

A boxing event at the Blackfriars Ring, London, had an unexpected termination on Monday afternoon. While the fight was in progress recruiting officers and police quietly entered the building and took possession of the exits. The hall was packed, and at five o'clock, when the spectators began to leave, every man of military age—and there were many—was challenged and ordered to produce his exemption certificate.

It was found that about 150 men had no document to show. They were at once rounded up. The process gave rise to some commotion, and several of the young men tried to escape. Some found their way to the lower roof, and one man actually made a dash for freedom by jumping from it. But escape was impossible, for a large force of police was under the bridge ready to seize any man who might pass into the street.

As the result of the raid, seven men of military age appeared at Tower Bridge police court on Tuesday. The charge in each case being that being amenable to the Military Service Act, they failed to attend when called up under the act. Two were fined 20 shillings, and four 40s. each, while one was ordered to prove his nationality at Stepney workhouse. The accused fined were handed over to the military authorities.
