Two Girls Paddle Down Mississippi

Iowa Students Frighten Rum
Runners With College Yells
on 2,000-Mile Trip.

New Orleans, La., Sept. 19.—Two
girls, students at the University of
Iowa, have just finished frightening
bootleggers for 2,000 miles down the
Mississippi River, which they have
paddled in a canoe from Iowa City to
New Orleans.

Once they were inadvertent guests
at an island camp of moonshiners, and
many a night their college yell caused
lights on rum runners to be extinguished.
But without exception they found the
smugglers courteous, chivalrous, and
even hospitable, when accosted.

Miss Ivy Leter of Bondurant, Iowa,
who is studying to be an English
teacher, and Miss Lillian Danielson of
Charles City, Iowa, a student of Journal-
ism, were the navigators. They
camped mostly on lonely banks or on
sandbars, and their only weapon of
defense was a stout ash paddle.

"Got a gun?" was the frequent
query.
"Sure, come and see," was the im-
mediate response. Yet neither has ever
fired a gun. But here is their own story:

"We were treated fine by everybody.
We ran into many bootleggers, but we
can say one thing for them, they were
courteous and hospitable. One bootleg-
ger at St. Louis painted our canoe for
us and others we met on way down the
