ST. JOHN CASE IN DIVORCE COURT

Fredericton, Jan. 22.—In the divorce court today G. Earle Logan asked for a decree for divorce a vinculo matrimonii in the suit of Evelyn Ward MacDonald vs. John Fleming MacDonald, a St. John action, which was tried sometime ago and in which the judge refused to grant a decree on ground of collusion. Mr. Logan moved for a decree on strength of the judgment of the Court of Appeal which had ordered a decree to issue. Mr. Justice Crockett in a lengthy judgment said the court would order a decree to issue solely on the responsibility of the Court of Appeal and upon its order.

Mr. Justice Crockett said that the court would issue no order for costs or for alimony and that no decree would issue until fees had been paid. If costs had been desired there should have been a motion for them. He said that evidence during the progress of the case showed that every arrangement for costs and alimony had been made between the two parties.

In *Elder Augustus Stocks vs. Frank C. Stocks*, a St. John case, the judge said he would order a decree of divorce to issue.
