Dentist Talks Back; Some Tall Charges

(Toronto Globe)

"When it comes to denying men the right properly to advertise, then they are wrong, and the public is backing me up," said Dr. W. A. MacLaren, dentist, to the Globe yesterday concerning the report of a committee of the Ontario Dental Association.

Dr. MacLaren said the paragraph from the Dentistry Act covering the question says that a practitioner must not be guilty of anything "unprofessional." The whole point turns on the meaning of the word "unprofessional," said Dr. MacLaren, who claimed that past judgments insist that the profession is not to be the judge, but what honest men deem proper or improper in a professional way.

Honest men think it proper to charge \$500 to extract the teeth of one patient—said Dr. MacLaren. "This is an actual case. Would this dentist be ethical according to many of his peers? Eminently so; the higher fee the more ethical the dentist.

"Honest men think it proper to charge a thousand dollars for an upper and lower set of teeth, that, exclusive of anything else, took, last year, four days to do. Honest men accept as proper a fee of \$500 to \$1000 for regulating the teeth of a 14-year-old boy of much humble means and modest environment. This has been done many times."

Dr. MacLaren said that, so far as he knew, advertising practitioners in the profession did not use unqualified help.
