Colonel F. S. Davis, C. M. S. Succeeds Lieutenant - Col-Colonel F. S. Davis, C. M. G.,


Ottawa, July 16.—To replace Lieut.—Colonel F. McKelvey Bell, who recently resigned his position as Director of the Medical Services for the Department of Soldiers' Civil Re-Establishment, the appointment has been made of Colonel E. G. Davis, C.M.G., M.D., as acting director. Colonel Davis, who has had a distinguished service overseas, is a son of the late Dean of Huron, and a resident of London (Ont.)

Before the war he was clinician of Western University Medical College, but was actively connected with the Canadian militia, being an officer commanding the Fifteenth Field Ambulance, since the year 1904. He went overseas in 1915 as a junior officer with No. 3 General Hospital. He was sent out to the Island of Lemnos in the Mediterranean but later was recalled to England where he was appointed colonel and sent to


