Day of Thankegiving to Almighty o you the people are looking God for the many mercies He has to get their rights in this matter. been pleased to bestow upon this Surely they are entitled to a Colony during the past year.

I do, therefore, by this my Proclamation, order and direct that MONDAY, the TWENTY FOURTH day of JANUARY instant, be set apart for the purpose aforesaid, to be observed as a Public and Bank Holiday throughout this Colony, of which all persons concerned are hereby required to take due notice and govern themselves accordingly.

Given under my Hand and Seal at the Government House St. John's, this 11th day of January, A. D., 1916.
