TRADES AND LABOR CONGRESS SESSION

(Continued from Page 1.) of salaries and wages commensurate with services rendered, with a minimum wage based upon the actual cost of living.

Under the heading of "Natural Resources" the Alberta Federation of Labor "strongly protests against exploitation of natural resources and standards of living and requests that same be checked by government supervision and control."

The London Trades and Labor Council calls attention to the fact that Central Canada is dependent on a foreign country for fuel for domestic use, and that stoppage of supply creates distress to the people of Canada.

The famous "Hanna order" prohibiting railway employees from contesting elections under pain of losing their positions, is attacked in a resolution from the Toronto District Labor Council, which requests the executive to take steps to effect or prevent the enforcement of the ruling.

The Associated Federal Employees of Canada (Ottawa civil servants) voice appointments out of the hands of the Civil Service Commission as a reversion to patronage and ask the government to rescind its order-in-council and return these classes to the competitive basis when appointments are made.

The Mine Workers of Nova Scotia are moving for support for the proposal of a Canadian government loan of \$15,000,000 to Russia. A resolution has been forwarded from District 26, U.M.W.A., and endorsed by West Toronto Brotherhood of Railway Car-men, No. 2381, as follows:

"Resolved, that seeing the Russian government has offered to accept a fifteen million dollar Canadian government distress loan said loan to be spent in Canada, for the purchase of wheat seed and grain to help the Russian famine sufferers, local union No. 4319 ask the Truro convention to endorse the said loan and instruct the secretary to take the necessary steps to have other bodies endorse the same and to take such steps as may be necessary to persuade the Dominion government to grant said loan to Russia.


PLAYGROUNDS OF ONTARIO.
