PROSPECTUS.

This Institution was founded by Rev. J. A. Provençal, in 1869, and is conducted by the Religious of the Order of Holy Cross. It combines the advantages of a christian education with those of a through commercial course. As is fully testified by the position now occupied by its alumni and the continued patronage of the public in general.

Students having a fair knowledge of their mother tongue, can also, after the fourth year be admitted to make a classical course, if they so desire and if it is the wish of their parents.

The principal branches taught are both the English and French languages. Penmanship, Arithmetic in all its parts, Geography, History, Algebra and Geometry, Book-keeping, Natural History, Literature and Rhetoric, Architecture and Drawing, Telegraphy and Phonography, the elements of Physics and practical Logic and also the rudiments of the sciences.

Doctor's fees charged extra. Books, stationery and mending also charged extra.

Payments always quarterly in advance either in gold or its equivalent.
