THE SUNDAY SCHOOL  
BASKETBALL LEAGUE

Organization Meeting Held in Y.M.C.A. Last Evening—Officers were Elected.

A meeting of the Sunday school basketball league was held at the Y.M.C.A. last evening for the purpose of organizing. J. W. P. Magee was elected president and Horace Wetmore, secretary-treasurer. The members of the executive are A. M. Grosse, Rev. I. W. Williamson and Rev. D. J. MacPherson. The league will include three divisions; the first, the junior division, boys up to and inclusive of 105 pounds weight; the intermediate, from 105 to 135 pounds, and the senior from 135 pounds up, no age limit being set.

A man on either the junior or intermediate teams will be able to play on a team above his own class in weight but once doing so cannot return to the lower division. So far fourteen teams have entered the league. All entries must be in by next Monday. The league will start playing a week from today and the schedule will cover a period of three weeks. During that time three games will be played at the Y. M. C. A. gym every Monday, Wednesday and Friday evening.

## WOMEN POLICE.

London, April 22.—The success of women police has been demonstrated in England, asserts the Inspector of Constabulary. Seven counties and twenty-four cities and boroughs have women on the staff and "their introduction into professional police work" says the inspector "may well help police authorities to combat evils which have presented increasing difficulties to them for years."

The inspector pays a tribute to the fine work being done by the women police employed by the Ministry of Munitions and refers also to the success of "Women Patrols." "Crime is no doubt showing an upward tendency after a remarkable fall, as was the case during the South African war," the inspector reports who adds: "To this the shortage of the police force no doubt contributes and the restriction of street lighting increases opportunity and temptation while reducing the possibilities of prevention and detection. There are crimes too, the prevalence of which directly due to the circumstances of the war, enforced separation of husband and wife. The temptations afforded by separation allowances are increasing the crime of bigamy."

KING GEORGE II. OF  
TONGA ISLANDS DEAD

Real King of the South Pacific Group is George V., but they Maintain Native Monarch.

Melbourne, Australia, April 30.—George II. King of the Tonga Islands, is dead.

The Tonga or Friendly Islands in the South Pacific ocean, have been under a British protectorate since 1900, although still possessing a native king. George II was forty-three years old.
