GILLIES, JOSEPH ALEXANDER, M.A. (*Richmond, N.S.*).

Descended from a Highland family resident in the Co. of Inverness, Scot. Third surviving s. of the late John Gillies of Inverness-shire, Scot., and Mary McLean, of Coll, Argyleshire. B. at Irish Cove, Red Islands, Cape Breton, 17 Sept., 1849. Ed. at St. Francis Xavier's Coll., Antigonish, N.S., where he graduated M.A., 1870. M., July, 1883, Josephine, dau. of Eulalie Bertrand, Prescott, Ont. Called to the Bar N.S., 1875. Was Clerk of the Peace for Cape Breton for several years, and subsequently Clerk of the Peace for the Municipality, and is now its solicitor. Was Registrar of Probate for the Co. from 1872 to 1887. An unsuccessful candidate for Cape Breton at g. e., 1887. First returned to Parlt. at g. e., 1891. His election being declared void, he was re-elected at by-election held 21 Jan., 1892, and re-elected at g. e., 1896. A Liberal-Conservative.—*Sydney, Cape Breton, N.S.*; *Rideau Club*.

GILMOUR, JAMES (*East Middlessex*).

GODBOUT, JOSEPH, M.D. (*Beauce*).

S. of Joseph Godbout, farmer, a descendant of the first settler in St. Vital de Lambton, Co. of Beauce. B. there 12 May, 1850. Ed. at the Seminary in Quebec
