HUOT, PIERRE GABRIEL, *N. P.* [*Quebec East.*] **L.**

S. of the late Mr. Pierre Huot, of Quebec. M. the dau. of Joseph Hamel, Esq., City Surveyor, Quebec. A Notary Public. Was one of the editors of *Le National*, a defunct rouge newspaper at Quebec. Returned for Saguenay, in L. A., Can., at g. e. 1854, but election declared null and void; re-elected 1855, and sat until g. e. 1857, when defeated. Was an unsuccessful candidate for Quebec, at the g. e. of the latter year. Returned to Leg. Coun., Can., for the division of Stadacona, 1861, but unseated on petition. Sat for present seat from g. e., 1861, until the Union. Returned to Commons by acclamation at last g. e. Pop. 18,770.—*Quebec, P. Q.*

HURDON, FRANCIS, *J. P.* [*South Bruce.*] **C.**

S. of Mr. James Hurdon, Camelford, Cornwall, Eng. B. there, 18 June, 1834. Ed. at Wadebridge, Eng. M., May, 1857, Charlotte S., dau. of Mr. Richard Chubb, of Devon, Eng. A grain merchant. Was a mem. of the Kincardine Council for two years, when he resigned. First returned to Parliament at last g. e., for present seat. Pop. 18,559. No. of voters, 4,066.—*Kincardine, Ont.*
