

Meetings to be open, and proceedings recorded.

17. The meetings of the Members of the Council shall be open to all Members of the said Corporation who may attend at the same, but they shall take no part in any proceedings thereat; and minutes of the proceedings at all meetings, whether of the said Council or the said Corporation, shall be entered in books to be kept for that purpose by the Secretary-Treasurer of the said Corporation; and the entry thereof shall be signed by the President of the said Council, or such other person as at the time shall preside over any such meeting; and such books shall be open at all reasonable hours to any Member of the said Corporation free from any charge.

Council to appoint Boards of Examiners, of Inspectors, &c.

18. From and after the passing of this Act, it shall be lawful for the Council of the said Corporation to appoint five persons to constitute a Board of Examiners for the Town of Windsor for the year commencing on the first day of January then next, and ending on the thirty-first day of December following, to examine applicants for the office of Inspector of Flour and Meal, or of any other article subject to inspection, and the said Council may do all such other Acts, matters and things connected with the inspection of flour and meal or any other article, and shall have as full power and be subject to the same conditions as those conferred upon and required of the Council of any Board of Trade, by virtue of any Act respecting the inspection of flour and meal, or of any other article subject to inspection; and the said examiners and inspectors shall also be subject to all conditions, requirements, oaths, matters, and things (touching their offices), set forth in the said Acts.

Oaths and affirmations.

19. Any person who may by law, in other cases, make a solemn affirmation, instead of taking an oath, may make such solemn affirmation in any case where by this Act an oath is required; and any person hereby authorized to administer an oath may in such cases as aforesaid, administer such solemn affirmation; and any person who shall wilfully swear, or affirm falsely, in any case in which an oath or solemn affirmation is required or authorized by this Act, shall be guilty of wilful perjury.

Her Majesty's rights, &c., saved.

20. Nothing in this Act shall affect any rights of Her Majesty, Her Heirs or Successors, or of any party or person whomsoever, such rights only excepted as are herein expressly mentioned and affected.
