An Act to provide for the separation of the City of Toronto from the United Counties of York and Peel, for judicial purposes.

WHEREAS it is expedient to provide for the separation, for judicial Preamble. purposes, of the City of Toronto from the United Counties of York and Peel; Therefore, Her Majesty, &c., enacts as follows:
