Apparently two months ago Dr. Trueman was offered the post at UNB. Thursday morning last Premier McNair called long distance to hear the decision. The decision "yes."

Since his arrival in Winnipeg in 1945 Dr. Trueman has acted as lecturer of English, in addition to his administrative duties. When asked if he would continue these duties at UNB, he expressed the hope that such a situation would be feasible, as it enabled an administrative officer to establish closer relationships

In a message to the students Dr. Trueman had this to say: "I have many regrets about leaving the University of Manitoba. I regret nothing more than the breaking off of these pleasant relations with the undergraduates. However, the call of New Brunswick has been too strong for me.
