UNB PROF IN NEW FIELD

Whether the grant from the Natural Science and Engineering Research Council (NSERC) comes in or not, UNB scientist Potpourri Stanley is determined to continue his research in the correlation between his sexual activity and the climatic conditions in Eastern Canada.

ANIMALS SPEAK OUT AT LAST!

The citizens of Canada were shocked nationwide last weekend when a "herd" of wildlife stormed Capital Hill protesting 'the damage man is inflecting upon the environment.'
