To me personally the word of Mr. Fielding's death, reviving, as it has, memories of the many years in which I was privileged to share with him an intimate association in Parliament and in the Government, has served to revive, as well, a sense of abiding obligation in what I owe to his constant friendship, helpful guidance, and more than obligations co-operation in the affairs of states one much younger in years and experience, I was, the Convention of 1919, entrusted by the Liberal party with its leadership; Mr. Fielding was the first in that great gathering to propose unanimity in the fieldings therefore to propose unanimity in the fieldings therefore to his never-failing co-operation thereafter, must be ascribed in the large part the success which attended the subsequent fortunes of the Party, both at the polls and in Parliament.
