To me personally the word of Mr. Fielding's death, reviving, as it has, memories of the many years in which I was privileged to share with him an intimate association in Parliament and in the Government, has served to revive, as well, a sense of abiding obligation in what I owe to his constant friendship, ~~helpful~~ guidance, and ~~more than chivalrous~~ co-operation in the affairs of state, ^{when as} one much younger in years and experience, I was, ^{at} ~~at~~ the Convention of 1919, entrusted by the Liberal party with its leadership; Mr. Fielding was the first in that great gathering to propose unanimity in the Convention's choice. To ^{Mr. Fielding's chivalrous} ~~his~~ action at that time, and to his never-failing co-operation thereafter, must be ascribed ^{much of} ~~the~~ ^{the} large part the success which ^{has} attended the subsequent fortunes of the Party, both at the polls and in Parliament.
