Ottawa, 10th November, 1913-

Sir,

I beg to enclose form of Surrender in Duplicate of a portion of land on The Pas Reserve, applied for by the Town of The Pas, for cemetery purposes, and to say that you are hereby authorized to submit the Surrender to the Indians, under and in accordance with the provisions of the Indian Act.

The meeting of the Indians should be called by due notice given in accordance with their rules, and if a majority assent to the Surrender, you should fill in the date therein, have it executed by a few of the Chief Indians, and witnessed by yourself, and an Affidavit of Execution ~~made~~ on the form attached, by yourself and the Chief and a Principal Man, before a Stipendiary Magistrate or a Justice of the Peace.

When returning Surrender, you should report the number of male members of the Band over twenty one years of age, resident on or near the Reserve, and entitled to vote, the number of Indians present at the meeting, the number voting for the Surrender, and the number voting against.
