
Ottawa, 25th August, 1914.

Sir,

In reply to your letter of the 15th instant, I beg to say that the Department has arranged with Agent Renaud to visit Wolfe Lake early in September. The Department approves of your accompanying him on the trip. The suggestion that you shall vaccinate the Indians while at Wolfe Lake meets with approval and the Department is ordering two hundred vaccine points to be sent to you from the Ontario Vaccine Farm, at Palmerston. When you receive the vaccine, kindly certify the account and hand it to the Indian Agent for transmission to the Department, provided the points are satisfactory.

I may add that you will be allowed remuneration at the rate of \$6.00 a day while on the trip to Wolfe Lake. You will also be allowed the cost of any medicines which it will be necessary for you to use in treating Indian patients.
