

Ottawa, June 18, 1918.

Sir,

I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 3rd instant enclosing a communication from the Rev. T. Ferrier, Superintendent of Methodist Indian Schools, in which he states that they are sending teachers for the summer months to Deer Lake, Pekangakum and Little Grand Rapids and asks that school supplies and biscuits be sent for these schools.

In reply I beg to say that the Department is ordering from the Government Stationery Office a supply of school material for each of these schools.

In reference to the biscuits I beg to say that you may send seventy-five pounds for the Pekangakum school, two hundred pounds for the Deer Lake school and one hundred and fifty pounds for the Little Grand Rapids school from the stock on hand at Winnipeg.
