composition, but it must be remembered that some of the pure waters have an undoubted therapeutical effect, and that chemical analysis, which is absolutely reliable only in its estimation of basic salts and acids, will not always explain the medicinal effects of a water, and that small quantities of some constituents are often more effective as remedial agents than others that are present in larger quantities.
