## GEORGETOWN.

An Incorporated Village, and Station of the Grand Trunk and Northern and North-Western Railways, in the Township of Esquesing. The River Credit passes through the Village, affording excellent waterpower, which is extensively utilized by a number of manufacturing establishments. The surrounding country is remarkable for its fertility. Population, 1,800. In the year 1820, George Kennedy and his family settled on the site of the Village, and in 1837 there were only three families in the settlement, those of Marquis Goodenow, Sylvester Garrison and the Pioneer, Kennedy, before mentioned, in whose honor the little Hamlet was named Georgetown, having, previous to this, been known as Hungry Hollow. In 1837, the Barber Bros. built their Woollen Mills. In 1840, John Sumpten opened the first store, and James Young opened another two years later. In 1864, the Village was Incorporated, and James Young was choosen Reeve.
