

instance, except it appears that there is a grave mistake such as to indicate that some false principle has been followed or that some evidence has been overlooked, or that there has been bad faith:

It this case, there is nothing of that kind appearing. The site chosen is practically the exact center of the district; there are children at the very extreme ends of the district on both sides, and although there are at the present time less children on the southern side than on the northern side, that state of things may at any times be changed.

I am of opinion that the decision of the commissioners which does not involve any expense, was a wise one and ought to be confirmed.

There is absolutely no proof that, from any point of view, the place now chosen is less convenient or lacks any of the qualities which a school site should have, in any greater degree than the old site did.

I am of opinion to dismiss the appeal, and it is dismissed with costs.

Judgment:—"Considering that it has been proved that said school section consists of properties fronting on a road running approximately north and south and about three miles in length; that the site chosen by the respondents fronts on that road about midway between one and the other and of the school section; that the site chosen, although not so high as that on which the present school rests, is nevertheless on rising land and easily drained; that the price to be paid for it is \$50 and that as much can be obtained by the respondents for the old site; that at the present time a considerable majority of children of school age reside toward the north of the chosen site; that lands fronting on said road and constituting the said
