THE PARCELS POST (From the Calgary Herald)

The advantages of a parcels post service are obvious. It tends to put producers and consumers and sellers and purchasers into closer relations and to eliminate one source of waste in distribution. The government is willing to carry parcels at the bare cost of transportation. It seeks no profit. If, therefore, it undertakes to maintain a parcels post of the modern sort it will encourage the producer at one end of the line to deal directly with the consumer at the other end. If the farmer could send his less perishable products direct to a city purchaser the latter could probably buy eggs, apples, potatoes and many other vegetables at a rate which would seem chean to him and yet eight forces. cheap to him and yet give the farmer a larger return than he now gets from the wholesaler. Both producer and consumer would become to some extent independent of the intermediaries who now play the middle against both ends. versely, the farmer could deal with the city producer and avoid the drain of several handlings of goods and of several


