

Thursday, 8th, June 1786.

THE Return of the Writ for two Members for the County of Sydney, one Member for the County of Cumberland, and one Member for the Town of Amberst, heing received by the House, it appeared that J. M. FrekeBulkeley and James Putnam Efgrs; were duly elected for the County of Sydney, Mr. Philip Marchinton, duly Elected for the County of Cumberland, and Mr. Charles Hill for the Town of Amberst, and they having taken the usualOaths before a Committee of His Majesty's Council, and there being then present Eleven Members and the Speaker, the House met, and a Message was sent to acquaint His Excellency the Governor, therewith.

A Meffage was received from His Excellency the Governor requiring the Attendance of the House in the Council Chamber,

The Speaker and the Houfe attended accordingly, and having returned, the Speaker reported to the House, that His Excellency was pleased to make the following Speech.

Gentlemen of the Council and House of Assembly,

T the Close of the last Session feveral Matters then before His Excellency's you were left undetermined and were deferred for further Speech. " confideration, and Refolutions in a future Seffion.

" I have therefore called you together thus early that you may re-" fume the Confideration of those Matters, and form fuch Conclusi-" ons on them as shall appear prudent and necessary, giving them is the Deliberation due to Matters of fuch importance.

" The Laws which will expire at the end of this Year, and should " be re-enacted will neceffarily come under your Obfervation, toge-" ther with those which require Addition, Amendment or Explana-"" tion.

"You will receive from the proper Officers all Papers necessary " for your Information, and I recommend to you Difpatch and 📽 Unanimity.
