Higgins, of Nova Scotia; Miss Minnie E. Chipman, Director in Art at Acadia Seminary; Mr. C. Edgar Chipman, of Honolulu, who with the bereaved husband, have the sympathy of a host of friends.

The funeral took place on Monday afternoon and was largely attended, the services being conducted by Rev. L. D. Morse, assisted by Rev. H. T. DeWolfe, principal of Acadia Seminary. A solo by Miss Archer, teacher of vocal music at the Seminary, added greatly to the beauty of the service. The interment was made in Willow Bank.
