## The New Year

is not very far distant and immedi ately after that the shipments of fertilizer begin to go out. Many of our customers handle their carload on the snow while the reads are good, others want to have it on hand and delivered before the planting season and others to avoid the delays which may come with a later order.

While it is too early yet to have any fixed idea of business next spring the general conditions ap-pear favorable for a much better fertilizer trade than a year ago. There is a distinct shortage of potatoes in Western Canada and United States which under usual conditions result in advanced prices. The shortage is much greater than two years ago when potatoes reached the high mark. However other conditions do not favor higher prices but merely a steady demand seems to be assured.

In the apple growing sections of Nova Scotia the shortage of apples in other sections has opened new markets. This has made a free movement of a large crop at reasonably good prices.

These improved markets compared with last year and the reduction in price from five dollars a ton in the lower grades up to a reduction of fifteen to twenty dollars in the higher grades will probably cause a larger demand for fertilizers with an earlier placing
