The charter is issued under the Companies' Act of Canada. The petition was presented by E. A. Reilly, K. C., of Moncton. The authorized capital is \$400,000.00 divided into four thousand shares of one hundred dollars. The head office of the Company will be at Moncton, and the Provisional Directors are Frederick Royal Sumner, Richard Percy Dickson and Budd A. Taylor. The Company is empowered to carry on a general hardware business in all its branches.

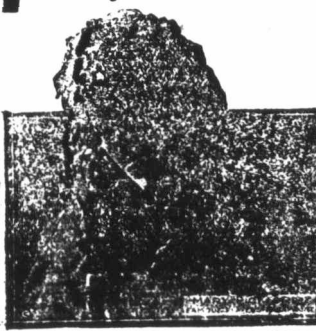
