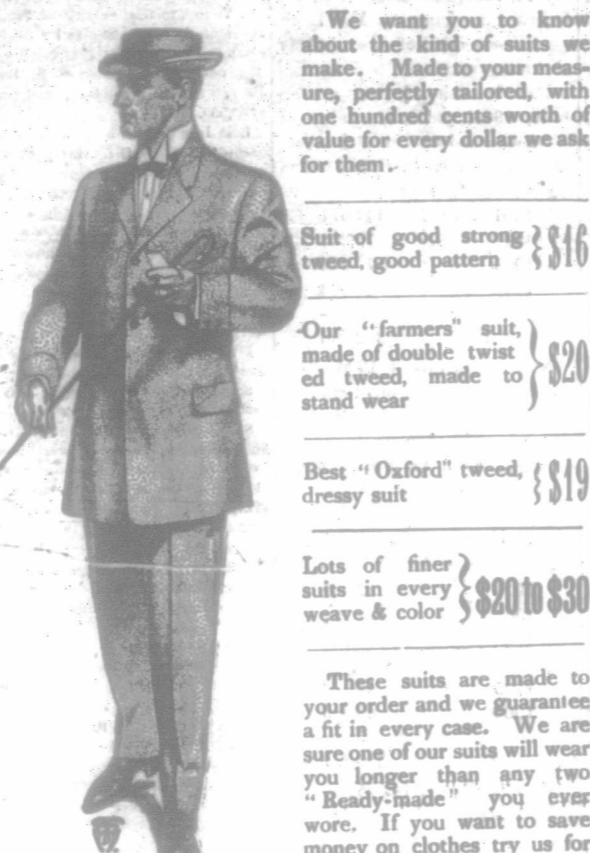

## Ottawa Weekly Letter.

### The Cowan Case

How A Conservative Got a Timber Limit.—The Example Furnished by Mr. Oliver.—What the Minister Did Not Know About It.

**\$74,000 TAKE OFF**

That Amount Was Paid to Brother-in-law Burrows.—And to Mr. A. W. Fraser, now Government Candidate in Ottawa.—But the Government Got Only \$6,000.

### A STORY OF HOGS

Minister Who Was Made to See.—Paid Three or Four Times What the Law Allowed.

### SASKATCHEWAN ELECTION

Another Blow to the Laurier Government.

Another Province Probably Captured by Conservatives.

OTTAWA, August 15th, 1908.

When Mr. Oliver and his colleagues in the Ministry were accused of improper disposal of timber limits to their friends they said Conservatives were allowed the same chance to buy. One case in proof was given over and over again. They said that William Cowan of Prince Albert, a Conservative, got a valuable limit just the same as Mr. Burrows, brother-in-law of the Minister in charge.

### MR. OLIVER'S RETORT.

Mr. Oliver made the most of this solitary case. "This was not a case of awarding berths to political favorites," he said, "it was a question of open competition," and then the Minister said he could prove it by birth No. 1047 for 250 square miles north of Prince Albert. Mr. Oliver explained, "One tender was for \$2,510 by Messrs. Burrows, the other for \$5,000 by William Cowan of Prince Albert. William Cowan is not a member of the Liberal party or a supporter of this Government. He was the Conservative candidate against the present Judge Lacombe in the provincial elections of 1905."

### VAINT PROTESTS.

There was excitement and alarm in Prince Albert town. The Board of Trade passed resolutions and sent them to Ottawa protesting against the sale of all this timber at once, asking for longer notice. Business men asked that six months be given for examination, and that if the whole of this timber must be sold, it should be sold in at least 10 limits instead of one or two. The Mayor of Prince Albert also wired a protest, but Commissioner Tarriff replied that the sale would go on. Mr. Cowan wanted this limit. If someone else got it his large mill would be out of business and he would be at the mercy of the monopolists. Mr. Cowan had come to understand that he would have no "proper arrangements" with the right man. He made them.

### AS IT APPEARED.

The 500 miles of timber were put up in two limits, 1,048 and 1,049, one the first choice of 300 square miles, the other the second choice. While the tenders were opened, there were only two bids for 1,048 and only one for 1,049. As Mr. Oliver stated, Mr. Cowan's bid for \$5,000 was the highest, and the limit was awarded to him. For the other 500 miles, John McNeil was the only bidder at \$1,000, and he got the award.

### MEMBERS WHO KNEW.

But an examination of the papers and an inquiry to the Public Accounts Committee showed the matter in a new light. Mr. Cowan did not write his own tender. He did not furnish the cheque. The tender was written by A. W. Fraser, the Ottawa politician, who is now the Government candidate in that city, and who has been mixed up with the Imperial Pulp Company and Mr. Burrows in a dozen Western timber deals, and has carried through several of his own. Mr. Fraser was before the committee, and testified that he had written the
