The book contains many caricatures of the Kaiser which have not hitherto been permitted circulation.

DUCHESS OF MARLBORO'S WILL. Offered For Probate in Long Island Court-Estate Left to Son. Riverhead, L. I., Jan. 13.-The will of the Dowager, Duchess of Marlborough, Lily Warren Beresford, was offered for probate before Judge Jos. M. Belford in the surrogate court. The value of the estate is not given, but it is said to be in the millions. The entire estate is left in trust for her son, Wm. De La Beresford, who is an infant under fourteen years old. Judge Wm. Rasquin, of Flushing, one of the executors named in the will, said that the estate was over \$40,000 personal and over \$100,000 real, all of which goes to the son, and that there would be no contest. Revenue stamps to the value of \$800 are attached to the document, it having been executed during the Spanish war revenue tax days.

Manila, Jan. 1.-Martin Osampo and Fidel Reyes, members of the editorial staff of the Philippine Daily Bencabuntino, were convicted today of having printed libelous articles regarding Dean C. Worcester, one of the Philippine commissioners, and were sentenced to six months in prison, in addition to a fine of \$100 each. The trial of Teodoro Kalawan, managing editor of the Press, is in progress. Worcester's complaint alleges that his personal and professional character had been attacked.
