From Our Boston Correspondent) curred last Monday, any number of explanations were offered. It was pointed out that money rates had been gradually tightening; that com-modity prices had reacted; that the decline in the franc offered renewed vidence of unstable financial condions abroad; that the grain markets been weak; that the steel industry was showing signs of slackening.
As a matter of actual fact, the business situation has not changed. It is just as favorable, in our opinion, as t has been right along. There have been no developments which should dispel the hopeful expectations with which the year was entered. But stock prices cannot keep going up con-tinuously just because industrial con-

ditions remain favorable. If they did. stocks would obviously reach a level far above their intrinsic value. As regards the stock market, comment generally leans too far toward theory and contains too little common sense. It stands to reason that, on account of the enthusiasm generated by advancing prices since last November, many stocks have been marked up to prices which have discounted possibliities rather than probabilities. A bull market puts many people in a frame of mind which makes them de-sirous of believing rumors of large profits, melons and favorable develop-ments which will affect certain stock issues, regardless of their source or reasonableness.

On the other hand, there are many stocks which have fallen far short of exhausing their possibilities and which analyses show to be still very cheap. But a period of readjustment of stock prices, in which issues have been advanced more rapidly than their prospects justify would be brught back o a more equitable level and prices in general made sufficietly attractive to cause interests who make profits on recent strength to repur chase, would seem likely.

It hardly seems possible that the technical position of the market, which became so weakened as to bring about the decline of last Monday, was corrected by a single day's decline. It would seem probable that for perhaps a month or more the major action of the market will consist of readjusting the prices of stocks which have advanced too rapidly, rather than exploiting the favorable prospects of other issues. But we believe that there are many stocks which, in such an event, it will prove

An 88-story office building towering the Woolworth Building, now allest in the world. A building, rising 33 stories above

the Woolworth tower is being discussed by eminent architects and engineers as a possibility of the future. An interesting phase of this discussion concerns the problematical engineering difficulties to be encountered in going so high above the loftiest structure so far attempted by man. The new building would be about 1250 feet high, or nearly a quarter of a mile, assuming that the floors would be similar in height to those of the Woolworth Building. This would make it 250 feet higher than the Eiffel Tower in Paris, the highest, structure of any kind in the world,

and about 460 feet higher than the

Woolworth Building. Engineers point out that exhaustive ests would have to be made to deternine not only the usual stresses and strains of such a structure, but also the strain caused by resistance to the When the Woolworth Building was finished tests made in an 80mile gale to determine what effect wind pressure had on it, showed that the building was unaffected by the strain. But just how much stronger a building half again as high would have to be to withstand the pressure of a hurricane is one of the problems that would have to be worked out carefully. To this end a detailed study of the reactions of New York skyscrapers during heavy blows is re ported to be in progress.
