'Blockade" Last Attempt To British Drop Bombs On Gun Mounts and Supply Trains, While French Airmen Attack Aerodrome and Keep Enemy From Meeting British.

[Canadian Press.]

LONDON, Feb. 16 .- 11:50 p.m. The air wing of the British navy today made another massed attack on the German positions along the Belgian coast in an effort to destroy or damage the submarine base at Zeebrugge, the guns at Ostend and Middelkerke, and the aerodrome at Chistelles.

According to the official report, good results were attained. Forty machines were utilized today, as compared with 34 in last week's attack.

OFFICIAL STATEMENT.

The official statement concerning the air raid

says: 'The air operations of the naval wing against the Bruges. Ostend and Zeebrugge districts were continued this afternoon. Forty aeroplanes and seaplanes bombarded Ostend, Middelkerke, Ghistelles and Zeebrugge.

"Bombs were dropped on the heavy batteries situated on the east and west side of Ostend, on gun positions at Middelkerke, on transport wagons on the Ostend-Ghistelles road, on the mole at Zeebrugge to widen the breach damaged in former attacks, on the locks at Zeebrugge, on barges outside Blankenberghe and on trawlers outside Zeebrugge

Eight French aeroplanes assisted the naval machines by making vigorous attacks on the Ghistelles aerodrome, thus effectively preventing German air craft from cutting off our machines. It is reported that good results were obtained.

'Instructions are always issued to confine attacks to points of military importance, and every effort is made by the flying officers to avoid dropping bombs on any residential portions of towns." GERMANS HELPLESS.

While the British airmen were dropping their bombs on the gun positions, the supply trains and barges and the trawlers used in mine-laying and mine-sweeping operations, eight French airmen attacked the Ghistelles aerodrome, thus preventing the German airmen from making any attempt to cut off the British machines.

The official report makes no mention of the airmen engaged, so it is presumed that they all returned safely. The day was bright and clear, conditions being more favorable than last week for a raid.

Magnificent Set of Men: Have Done Excellent Work.

WHY PROGRESS IS SLOW

Valuable Point Secured At LaBassee With Severe Losses to Enemy.

"They are a magnificent set of men and have done excellent work in the trenches."—Sir John French's ribute to the Princess Pats.

LONDON, Feb. 16 .- 5:40 p.m .- The first of the bi-weekly communications from Sir John French, commander-inchief of the British army in the field, for which the war office arranged as a concession to the public demand for more news concerning the progress of the war, was made public by the official information bureau today. It is as follows: "Since our successes near La Bassee

at the beginning of last week, there has been less activity in that area. We nevertheless made further progress in this quarter, and on the 13th a valuable point was secured with loss. "We have consolicated our hold on the ground gained, and conclusive evidence has been obtained that the enemy's losses in the recent fighting thereabouts have been severe. Lost Ground Recovered.

"In the Ypres district the enemy attacked our line on the 14th and succeeded at first in gaining possession of a few trenches. Counter-attacks were made by us and the ground lost was recovered, some prisoners being cap-

"On the ren,ainder of the front there has been some increase in intensity in the artillery duel, in which we have shown a marked superiority. Direct hits have in several instances been secured on the enemy's guns, and much damage has been done to his defences. "In spite of the bad weather our aircraft carried out their accustomed tasks with conspicuous success.
