# **High Prices** For Seal Skins

Season's Catch Sold in London at Highest Figure on Record.

Sealers Jubilant Over Result as 1902 Was an Off Year.

The sale of seal skins held in London the safe of seaf skins field in London seterday brought the highest price ever alized for the skins taken by the dagic sealers, the average being 91.6, pelagic sealers, the average being 91.6, or about \$22.26, for the skins taken in Behring Sea, an advance of 40 per cent on the price realized last season, and the highest price ever realized for the Behring Sea skins. This top notch price was realized at the Hudson's Bay company's sale, while the skins sold at Lampson's—where about half the catch was sent—received 7-6 less on the average, than the skins sold by the Hudson's Bay company. The skins sold by Lampson's were mostly those, taken on the British Columbia Coast, although there were some Behring Sea and Japages skins, the Behring Sea skins being were some Behring Sea and Japoskins, the Behring sea skins being taken by the schooner Umbrina, hoperates outside the Sealing combet. Her skins brought an average of shillings, while those sold at the Ison's Bay brought an average of

The favorable results were anticipated for some time past, for in view of the favorable trade conditions existing in Great Britain and Europe, and the continuance of a spell of cold weather in Europe for the past six weeks, which has been a factor in the handsome prices realized. The smallest of the catch last season was owing to the extremely bad weather encountered by the sealing fleet, which resulted in the loss of the Hatzic with all on board during the spring cruise, and fears are also felt for the Rend. The weather was bad throughout the world, for the English fisheries suffered by reason of the storny weather, and never in the history of the Newfoundland fisheries have there been so many vessels lost and so much disaster to the vessels as during this year.
