The spirit of self-reliance, of usefulness, of faith in the good will of their fellow-men has been preserved and strengthened behind the bars, and the convicts see the bright light of "the chance" looming in the horizon.

New Jersey's reformatory at Rahway is an institution where the prisoners study themselves. Doctor Frank Moore, the superintendent, tells his charges that his business is not to criticize the bad but to find the good and cultivate it. And so his scheme of giving the prisoners the power of self-government and self-discipline has worked out successfully. In two years worked out successfully. In two years the infractions of the prison's rules decreased from 4889 to 2887. The older inmates, who are working for the privilege of being treated like citizens, are seldom reported, and their conduct has done much to tame the new in-
