

THE FODDER CROP

There will be wide variation in the quality of hay harvested in Ontario this year. Much that was stored before the end of June was in prime condition on going into the barn, but the exceptionally heavy rainfall which came with the first of the present month caused serious injury to that still lying in the field. The total hay crop of the province is, however, so large that, taking quantity and quality together, the general hay situation can safely be stated as being up to the average at least. Moreover, the injury sustained by hay as a result of this week's downpour has been more than counterbalanced by the beneficial effects on other crops.


