Some time ago the People's Heat and Light Co. secured permits from the I. C. R. authorities to test coke on the locomotive running on the Dartmouth branch. The test has been going on for about a month and the results have been so satisfactory that arrangements are in progress to have the coke tested on the express train locomotive between Halifax and Sydney.
