These flies, many of which have the wings very prettily mottled, are all poorly represented in the collection, although some of the species are probably quite common.

## DIOPSIDÆ.

- Sphyracephala brevicornis*, Say This curious fly is not often observed.

## SEPSIDÆ.

- Nemopoda cylindrica*, Fabr. Two specimens.
- Sepsis violacea*, Meig. Two specimens.

## TRYPETIDÆ.

- Trypetta longipennis*, Wied. Common; May and June,
- Trypetta sparsa*, Wied. One specimen, August 22nd.
- Trypetta solidaginis*, Fitch. Galls common on goldenrods.
- Trypetta tabellaria*, Fitch U. S. Nat. Mus.
- Trypetta florescentiae*, Linn. U. S. Nat. Mus.

## ORTALIDÆ.

- Rivellia flavimana*, Loew. Two specimens.
- Chætopsis ænea*, Wied. Our commonest species; May and June.
- Seoptera vibrans*, Linn. Also common.

## SAPROMYZIDÆ.

- Sapromyza notata*, Fall.
- Sapromyza philadelphica*, Macq.
- Sapromyza lupulina*, Fabr.
- Lauxania cylindricornis*, Fabr.

The members of this family are poorly represented in the collection.

## OSCINIDÆ.

- Chlorops proxima*, Say.
- Chlorops assimilis*, Macq.
- Chlorops variceps*, Loew.
- Eurina exilis*, Coq.

The foregoing remark applies equally well to this family.

## DROSOPHILIDÆ.

- Drosophila ampelophila*, Loew. A large number bred from grapes.
- Drosophila colorata*, Walk. U. S. Nat. Mus.
