BUSINESS NOTES.

Ranbury, Gourlay & Ranbury, lumber, Wolseley, N. W. T., have been succeeded by Ranbury Bros.

A. Roughtner, manufacturer of hoops and staves, Aylmer, Ont., has sold out to H. Balcomb & Son.

H. W. Hilliard, lumber dealer, Minnedosa, Man., is opening a branch at Clan William, Man.

The schooner "Joseph Hay" has been chartered to carry lumber from Weymouth, N. S., to Havana, at \$5 75.

CURRENT TRADE CONDITIONS.

ONTARIO.

The lumber market, from the standpoint of the manufacturer, is all that could be desired. Prices are high and the demand good. Confidence is expressed universally that the coming season will witness a large consumption of lumber, perhaps sufficient to sustain the present strength of the market. The range of prices both for dry stock and the new cut is slightly wider than usual. For No. 1 cuts of last year's stock as high as \$52 at the mill is being asked, while purchases have been made recently as low as \$46. This discrepancy is accounted for in part by the different grading of mills. For 4, 5 and 6 inch mill run \$20 is being asked, and for 8 inch \$21. The price of 12 inch is nominal, as there is practically no stock that has not passed out of first hands.

The large number of entire mill cuts that have already been placed under contract is surely an indication of the great strength of the market. Dealers are evidently anxious to make arrangements for their season's supply in order that they may be in a position to meet the wants of their customers. The prices paid this winter for log run are, we believe, unprecedented in the history of the lumber trade. Interviews with a number of the leading manufacturers indicate that the range of prices for log run is from \$19 to \$25, with few sales above \$22. It is learned that one operator is asking \$19 for his logs delivered at the river bank.

Within the past month there has been an advance of \$1 in the price of hemlock lumber, for which wholesale dealers are now paying \$14 f.o.b. cars Toronto. Four stocks on the Northern Division of the Grand Trunk Railway aggregating over 3,000,000 feet recently changed hands at \$11.50, which is the average price at the mills.

It is difficult to review the hardwood market. There has developed such a scarcity of certain dry stock that prices are largely in the hands of manufacturers. Such advances as have taken place, however, have been of a conservative nature. The outlook for the new cut is promising.

QUEBEC AND NEW BRUNSWICK.

Manufacturers in the Eastern Provinces are looking forward to a good season. Many of them have already sold a considerable portion of their estimated cut, and the price received has in most instances been above the average price of last year. The shingles market remains practically unchanged, although the price of \$3.40 for extras is being paid more willingly by buyers.
