Hon. Joseph Howe at Detroit on Reciprocity.

The Nova Scotia Leader Before the Great International Convention of 1885—A Stranger in a Foreign Land at a Time of International Ill-feeling—A Masterpiece of Eloquence.

On June 14, 1885, there was held at Detroit a great international convention on the subject of the reciprocity treaty, the agitation for the ratification of which was then going on.

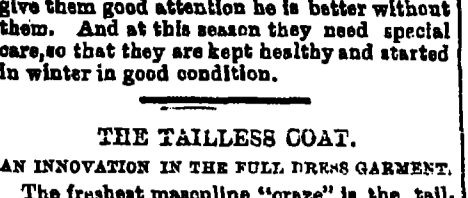
