PREFACE

On August 1, 1973, the Lester B. Pearson Building was declared open by Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II of Canada. During the previous two months most of the Headquarters staff of the Department of External Affairs had slipped into the building on a scheduled series of smoothly executed weekend moves.
