STATEMENT BY MR. DEPUTY SPEAKER

MR. DEPUTY SPEAKER: Under the relevant Standing Order, it might be appropriate if the Chair were to suggest a grouping of the motions which are now before the House. Of course, these are only suggestions. I know that honourable Members will not hesitate to advise the Chair if they have other suggestions.

It is suggested that Motions numbered 1 and 2 should be combined for debate, but voted upon separately. Motion numbered 3 is to be considered and disposed of separately. Motions numbered 4, 5, 7 and 8 should be grouped for debate. A decision on Motion numbered 4 also will dispose of Motions numbered 5, 7 and 8.

Motions numbered 6 and 21 should be combined for debate, and a vote on Motion numbered 6 also will dispose of Motion numbered 21. Motions numbered 9, 10 and 11 to be considered and disposed of separately. Motions numbered 12 and 13 should be grouped for the purpose of debate and a vote on Motion numbered 12 also will dispose of Motion numbered 13.

Motions numbered 14 and 15 to be considered and disposed of separately. Motions numbered 16 and 17 to be grouped for purposes of debate and a vote on Motion numbered 16 also will dispose of Motion numbered 17. Motions numbered 18 and 19 to be grouped for purposes of debate and a vote on Motion numbered
