CANADA REGISTRATION BOARD.

Mr. KAY:

1. Is the Canada Registration Board still in existence? If so, how many employees has it and what is the monthly cost to the country?

2. What was the total cost of registering the men and women of Canada in the summer of 1918?

3. What practical use has been made of the information secured by this registration?

Hon. Mr. ROWELL:

1. No, the services of the last employee were dispensed with February 12, 1919.

2. \$491,900.44.

3. (a) Approximately 107,000 volunteers for agricultural work were secured, and names and addresses given to provincial authorities, who drew largely from this supply;

(b) A complete list of the names and addresses of French, Belgian and Italian citizens in Canada of military age was prepared, at the request of the Consuls-General, for recruiting purposes on completion of the conventions between these countries and Canada, which were in process of negotiation.

(c) The names and addresses of approximately 66,000 Russians in Canada were on application furnished to the Department of Justice.

(d) A complete tabulation, by ages, was made, showing all men physically fit, of every nationality; thereby providing accurate information as to available man-power for military purposes for use had the war continued and further drafts been necessary.

(e) Various other tables of important information gathered from the registration statistics showing the number of male persons, British born, British naturalized and of alien birth or naturalization, by constituencies, have been tabulated and will appear in the board's printed report.

(f) Tabulated information respecting the number of workmen available and skilled in various trades, to enable the best possible distribution of labour, would have been prepared had the Armistice not intervened, thereby rendering the expense of compiling this information unnecessary.
