NOTICES OF MOTIONS.

For Tuesday, December 4, 1906.

No. 1. By the Honourable Mr. Ferguson:—

November 26—That he will call the attention of the Government to an Address passed by the Legislative Assembly of British Columbia on the 12th of March last, urging the Government of Canada to establish life-saving appliances on the west coast of Vancouver island; and will inquire of the Government if any action has been taken by the Government in providing such life-saving appliances?

No. 2. By the Honourable Mr. Ferguson:—

November 26—That he will call the attention of the House to the serious loss of life caused by the recent wreck of several vessels on the north coast of Prince Edward Island, and to the absence of life-saving appliances in that locality; and will inquire of the Government if they intend taking action to provide absolutely necessary facilities to aid in the preservation of the lives of seamen on that coast?

No. 3. By the Honourable Mr. McDonald (Cape Breton):—

November 26—That he will inquire whether the Government has bought a site for a public building at Glace Bay? When? What price was paid? Was there a report made by a Government engineer respecting such a site, and were there more than one site reported on? Do the Government intend to ask for tenders for the construction of a public building soon?

No. 4. By the Honourable Mr. Ferguson:—

November 26—That he will call the attention of the House to the report of A. P. Low, B.Sc., F.R.G.S., at present Director of the Geological Survey, on the Dominion Government expedition to Hudson bay and the Arctic islands on board the Dominion
