5. The Law Sociaty Terms are as follows:

Hilary Term, first Monday in February, lasting two weeks.
Easter Term, third Monday in May, lasting three weeks.
Trinity Term, first Monday in September, lasting two weeks.

Michaelmas Term, third Mrinday in November, lasting three weeks.
6. The primary examinations for Students-atLaw and Articled Clerks will begin on the third Tuesday before Hilary, Easter, Trinity and Michaelmas Terms.
7. Graduates and matriculants of universities wili present their diplomas and certificates on the third Thursday before each term at in a.m.
8. The First Intermediate examination will begin on the second Tuesday before each term at 9 $\mathrm{a}, \mathrm{m}$. Oral on the Wednesday at $2 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{m}$.
9. The Sacond Intermediate Examination will begin on the second Thursday before each Term at $9 \mathrm{a} . \mathrm{m}$. Oral on the Friday at $2 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{m}$.
10. The Solicitors' examination will begin on the Tuesday rext before each term at $9 \mathrm{a} . \mathrm{m}$. Oral on the Thursday at $2.30 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{m}$.
ir. The Barristers' examination :.ill begin on the Wednesday next before each Term at 9 a.m. Oral on the Thursday at $2.30 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{m}$.
12. Articles and assignments must not be sent to the Secretary of the Law Society, but must be fled with either the Registrar of the Queen's Bench or Common Mleas Divisions within three months from date of execution, otherwise term of service will date from date of filing.
13. Full term of five years, or, in the case of graduates of three years, under articles must be served before certificates of fitness can be granted.
14. Service under articles is effectual only after the Primary examination has been passed.
15. A Siudent-at-Law is required to pass the First Intermediate examination in his third year, and the Second Intermediate in his fourth year, unless a graduate, in which case the First shall be in his second vear and his Second in the first six months of his third year. One year must elapse between First and Second Intermediates. See further, R.S.O., ch. 140 , sec. 0, sub-secs. 2 and 3 .
16. In computation of time entitling Students or Articled Clerks to pass examinations to be called to the Bar or receive certificates of fitness, examinations passed before or during Term shall be construed as passed at the actual date of the examination, or as of the first day of Term whichever shall be most favourable to the Student or Clerk, and all students entered on the books of the Society during any Term shall be deemed to have been so untered on the first day of the Term.
17. Candidates for call to the Bar must give notice, signed by a Bencher, during the preceding Term.
18. Candidates for call or certificate of fitness are required to file with the secretary their papers and pay their fees on or before the third Saturday before Term. Any candidate failing to do so will be required to put in a speciai petition, and pay an additional fee of $\$ 2$.
19. No information can be given as to marks obtained at examinations.
20. An Intermediate Certificate is not taken in lieu of Primary Examination.
