TECHNICAL EDUCATION

Address by Prof. Robertson Before
Business Women's Club.

The work of the commission on conservation and the royal commission on industrial education and technical education was the subject of an informal address by Prof. T. W. Robertson, before the Business Women's Club, in the technical school auditorium, on Saturday evening, "Conservation," said Prof. Robertson, "is not saving or leaving our resources unused, but it is making everything we have serve to its greatest possible extent." He discussed briefly the work that the commission does through its committees on mines, fisheries, water power and lands, and showed that the proper use of these resources will be of the greatest assistance in upbuilding Canadian national life. Much harm has been done because of ignorance in such matters. An instance of this is the recent failure of the Newfoundland fishery, which was the result of not any lack of fish in the sea, but of the fact that while Newfoundlanders can catch fish, they do not know how to hunt them. Speaking of the commission on technical education, Prof. Robertson said: "There never was a greater fallacy thrust upon the human race than that Latin and Greek are cultural subjects. True education, the speaker declared, had three elements: Hand and eye training, the development of the intelligence, and social experience. Manual training, which itself is as old as the race, has been too much neglected among us, and in attempting to restate it in its proper place, the royal commission is trying to establish 'the basis to make the nation fit to match the home.'"
