VIADUCT WILL ADVANCE PROSPERITY OF TORONTO

Bloor-Street Improvement Will Bring Surrounding Population Closely Into Touch With City.

On Friday the Bloor-Danforth viaduct project comes before the civic board of works. They will discuss the matter and will ask the city engineer for a report so that the question can be submitted to the people.

Already 900 persons have signified that they favor it by signing a petition. The Bloor-Danforth viaduct will be one of the most important local improvements ever undertaken by the city.

There is but little doubt in the minds of those competent to judge but that the matter will pass on Jan. 1.

At present if the residents of a street wish underground lighting, they are told that the maximum cost will be \$250 per foot. That seems too high to many.

Will Build Hospital. Mayor Geary declares he has some schemes up his sleeve whereby he will push thru the erection of the Isolation Hospital on the land that has been purchased. He says the hospital will be built there, while the York Township Council says it will not.


