This week's wheat markets have exhibited some irregularity with the tendency of prices decidedly upward. On the Chicago board since Saturday last this month's uelivery has advanced 2%c per bushel and the Dec. and March options 1%c and 1c respectively. The cause of the upturn has been the fallure of receipts to more than meet actual requirements and a consequent appreciation in the value of the cash article in Northwest markets. Farmers are believed to be stacking their wheat and postponing threshing until better prices arrive. Liverpool has fully responded and on that market spot red winter is to-day quoted 4½d per cental, the Sept. delivery 1%d and the December option 1d higher man a week ago. Saturday Evening, Sept. 17. man a week ago.

As for new Ontario wheat the price asked by farmers is still away above export possibilities and consequently none is moving. Farmers seem to be in a position to wait, though they seem likely to be disappointed if they look for higher prices. Malers are paying 65c at north and west points for current supplies.
